Smart commuters know that getting to South Florida's three major airports is easy and affordable when you ride Tri-Rail, which offers convenient shuttle service to the Fort Lauderdale/Hollywood International Airport and Palm Beach International Airport terminals, plus a seamless connection to Miami International Airport.

Savvy passengers who take the train to the plane enjoy:

- One-way fares as low as \$2.50
- 18 conveniently located train stations
- Direct shuttle connections to and from the airports
- Onboard luggage racks
- Free onboard Wi-Fi
- Free parking at train stations

How to get to MIA: Passengers with flights out of Miami International Airport can take Tri-Rail to the Miami Airport Station, then take MIA Mover directly to the terminals.

How to get to FLL: Tri-Rail offers shuttle bus service (Shuttle Route FLA 1) directly to FLL at terminals 1, 3 and 4, which passengers can access at Tri-Rail's Fort Lauderdale/Hollywood International Airport Station at Dania Beach.

How to get to PBI: Tri-Rail offers free, non-stop shuttle bus service to and from Palm Beach International Airport and the West Palm Beach Station.



HURRICANE SEASON IS HERE AGAIN



This is the time of year when we remind our passengers of our hurricane procedures. Since taking over the maintenance and dispatch of the corridor in March 2015, SFRTA is responsible for everything that happens on these tracks. That includes deciding when the system is closed down if a hurricane is approaching.

Once sustained winds reach 35 miles per hour, it becomes necessary for us to suspend service in order to secure the gates. Our policy has always been, and continues to be, that we will not take you to a destination unless we are sure we can get you back later. As usual, the customer service call number 1-800-TRI-RAIL (874-7254), Tri-Rail's website www.tri-rail.com and the local media are your best sources for information and updates in the event of a storm.

Here's hoping that you won't need this information, but now is the time to prepare, not when a storm is approaching. Make a plan to keep yourself and your family safe.

SFRTA GOVERNING BOARD ELECTS NEW CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR

Broward County Commissioner Tim Ryan was elected chair and Palm Beach County Commissioner Steven L. Abrams was elected vice chair during the June 24 meeting of the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority Governing Board.

Commissioner Ryan, a lifelong resident of Broward County, was elected to the Broward County Commission in

November 2012 and was elected mayor of the county in November 2014. He represents District 7, which includes the cities of Dania Beach, Lazy Lake, and Wilton Manors, as well as parts of Davie, Fort Lauderdale, Hollywood, and the Broadview Park neighborhood. Before his election to the Broward County Commission, he served for eight years in the Florida House of Representatives from 1998-2006 before leaving office due to term limits. During his time in the legislature, Ryan focused on legislative initiatives to protect consumers, improve public education, enhance accountability, and ethical standards for elected officials, and to protect our state's environment and natural resources. Commissioner Ryan follows in a long family tradition of public service to the people of Broward County.

Commissioner Steven L. Abrams has been a member of the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners since 2009, winning reelection twice. He had the distinction of serving as the first mayor of Palm Beach County in 2013. Commissioner Abrams has a lengthy record of public service. He is the former mayor of Boca Raton, having been elected in 2001 and reelected in 2003 without opposition. During the 2005 election, he received the most votes in the city's history and was later named mayor emeritus when he stepped down in 2008 due to term limits. He also served five terms as a Boca Raton council member from 1989 to 1999 and was a member of the city's Planning and Zoning Board from 1987 to 1989. As mayor of Boca Raton, he came to national attention for his handling of the anthrax attack on the AMI Building, receiving the Distinguished Service Medal from the Israeli National Police in recognition of his leadership during the ordeal.

How to get there: Take Tri-Rail to Hollywood Station. Transfer to Hollywood Train to Trolley.
